WASHINGTON — Old-fashioned and conservative Democrats will join with the Republicans in demanding a law divorcing WPA from politics. It is one of the curious by-products of a crazy and confused political campaign.

Almost every important Democrat—minor New Dealers like Roosevelt and Cohen, friendly Rooseveltians like Foy Kohler and Guy Guffey, anti-White House-like Senators Bailey and Byrd—figures that the WPA is no longer a political asset.
