WILLKIE LEADS IN DUNN'S POLL

NEW YORK, Oct. 10.—(UP)—The Republican national committee yesterday made public the results of the Dunn poll which forecasts the election of Wendell L. Willkie with a minimum of 334 electoral votes.

Using methods which the Republicans said were tested with considerable accuracy in the 1936 presidential and 1938 congressional elections, the Dunn sampling showed that the Republican presidential nominee "undoubtedly" would carry all the states north of Virginia, Kentucky, Arkansas and Oklahoma and in addition, would win Colorado, Wyoming and Oregon.

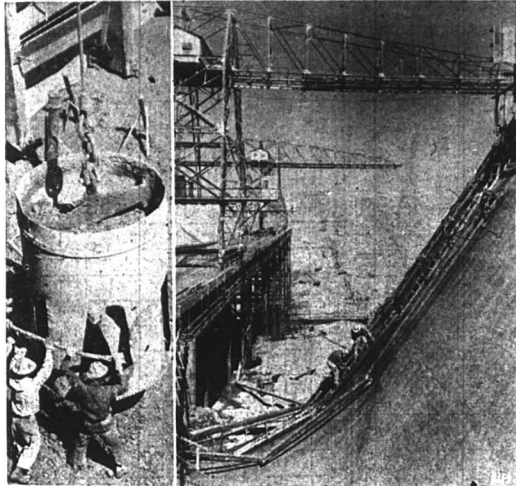
Figures in Dunn's statistical analysis also direct the survey claimers to have found means of overcoming handicaps encountered by other polls, specifically those which have run contrary to his findings and predicted the overwhelming reelection of President Roosevelt. One of the means it appears was consideration of the state of WPA workers in each state.

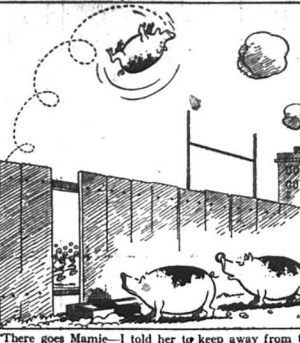
\$1,194 AWARDED IN DAMAGE SUIT
