

# Draft Is U.S. Answer to War Mongers, Says F.D.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 16.—(UP)—President Roosevelt today told the estimated 16,000,000 young men who are registering for the nation's first peacetime draft that their cause is to save democracy and peace from those "who have dared to threaten the whole world with war."

In an unprecedented early morning radio address—an hour after registration began—the president said that the program upon which the nation has embarked was one "obviously of peace preparation and of defensive preparation only," but that "the duty of this day has been imposed on us from without."

**MUST PREPARE**  
"Those who have dared to threaten the whole world with war—those who have created the name and deed of total war—have imposed upon us and upon all free peoples the necessity of preparation for total defense," he said.

"Today's registration for training and service," he said, "is the keystone in the arch of our national defense."  
To the 16,000,000 young men who registered today, I say that democracy is your cause—the cause of youth. Your act today affirms not only your loyalty to your countrymen, but your will to build your future for yourselves.

**WILLIE TALKS TOO**  
Mr. Roosevelt spoke from the basement room in the White House in the presence of only a few aides and radio engineers.

### LONDON IS 'SEA OF FLAMES'—BERLIN

1,000 German planes dropped 2,200,000 pounds of bombs on London in what they called reprisals for the alleged bombing of German civilians by the Royal Air Force.

Informants indicated that their night attack had been one of the most terrible in aerial history. OBJECTIVES UNDAUNTED  
In London there was no tendency to underestimate the severity of the all-night attack. For hours buildings rocked with the blast of bombs and anti-aircraft fire. It was heavy that it was almost impossible to walk through the streets.

It was emphasized, however, that the Germans were indulging in terror in order to direct mainly at the civilian population of London.
