SAWMILL WAGE PARLEY SLATED

TACOMA, Oct. 15. (UP)—Representatives of all A. F. L. sawmills operating on the Puget Sound basin from Tacoma to Bellingham and of the Lumber and Sawmill Workers' union, F. L. of the Puget-Sound Council will Monday start industry-wide wage negotiations.
The conference has been called by Federal Conciliator E. P. Marsh of Seattle as a step toward settlement of the timber strike, which closed 11 mills three weeks ago.
It was believed that Ned Stone, Seattle mill operator, would head the representatives of the employers, while Earl Hartley, Tacoma, president of the Puget Sound Council, would be chief representative of the unions.
The conference will be to negotiate demands of the district unions for a 7 1/2 cents per hour wage increase and one week's vacation per year with pay.

Two Meetings Dated by Kitsap Farmers
On Monday a meeting will be held in Seattle for poultry cooperatives and county agents of north-west Washington, they will determine accomplishments to date in the state disease control demonstrations carried out in the past year by farmers who have studied the results of controlled conditions in their own poultry flocks.
Those who will attend from Kitsap county will be Extension Agent Walter Clarkson, Douglas R. White of Gleeswood, John Wazli of Pouabou and George Mukal of Kingston.
On Oct. 24 and 25 the Kitsap county agricultural conservation committee will meet in Seattle with other committees of the district to learn details of the 1941 program. To attend from Kitsap county will be W. H. Barber, chairman of the committee, Theodore Hiltstad of Silverdale, W. H. Smith of Port Orchard, Clarkson and Miss Gladys Hanson of the Kitsap extension office, who will assist in carrying out the 1941 program in Kitsap county.

SEWARD, Alaska, Oct. 15. (UP)—Gov. Ernest Gruening today set Jan. 22 as the tentative date on which Alaskan males between the ages of 21 and 35 must register under the selective service act.

Hurd Conviction Is Sustained by Court
OLYMPIA, Oct. 15. (UP)—Conviction of Guy W. Hurd, former Clatsop county judge, on indictment on malfeasance charges for accepting rebates from two employees, was sustained by the supreme court late Thursday.
He was sentenced to 90 days in jail and fined \$400 for accepting \$31 from Maud Olson and \$36 from Maud Pitt. The money was given Mrs. Hurd to reimburse her for work she allegedly performed at home. Hurd was defended by the county grand jury.

170 RESCUED IN BOMB SHELTERS

LONDON, Oct. 15. (UP)—Rescue workers today brought out 170 persons alive from two shelters hit by a German bomb last night. The rescue crews had worked all night, digging through debris to bring the trapped citizens to the surface. The shelters in which they were buried were attached to a municipal apartment project.
The bomb struck just after London's night alarm sounded last night. Passways out of the shelters were blocked by broken masonry and timbers.
Rescue crews, quickly removed 10 injured persons and five bodies. Fifty more persons managed to get out by using special emergency ladders leading to the courtyard of the apartment house.
The rescue operation was still under way this afternoon. More persons still are believed in the shelters, crews of them children. Rescue crews hoped that they would be able to bring many of these persons out alive.

Stern Decrees Bar Jews From France's Public Life

VICHY, France, Oct. 15. (UP)—Government decrees were published today barring Jews from participation in public life and in some private activities and authorizing the confinement of foreign Jews in concentration camps.
The decrees are applicable in all French territory on the continent, in Corsica and Algeria, and in all French Colonies and French mandated territory.
The "French statutes" was published in the official journal and thus enacted.
The first barred Jews from the cabinet, the government departments, courts, national, regional, colonial and municipal faculties of public schools and universities, the army, navy and air force and the fields of the press, the wire, the movie trade and the theater.
Those Jews who now hold posts in the public service must give them up within two months.
