Superintendents, Directors Will Draft New Aid Plan

LONDON, Oct. 25.—(UP)—Germany built a terrific day and night air attack on London today, equalling in intensity the heaviest assaults the Luftwaffe ever has made in Britain. The attack raged all day long. The evening bombing started slowly but quickly picked up in volume. The bombing was reminiscent of the early days of the German mass attacks.

DISLOGGED BY PLANE ROCK STRIKES SHIP

Four-Hour Attack on Chungking Staged by 42 Planes

CHUNGKING, Oct. 25.—(UP)—The U. S. gunboat Tutuila of the Yangtze River was damaged severely today when it was struck by a 406-pound rock dislodged during a four-hour Japanese air raid.
