SURPRISES DUE FOR ENEMIES, SAYS FUHRER

Hitler Boasts Again of Germany's Land and Air Forces

BERLIN, Jan. 30.—(UP)—Adolf Hitler said today that American aid for Great Britain will be torpedoed and Europe will defend itself should the people of the American continent enter the war.

Hitler told a cheering crowd of 20,000 at the Berlin Sports Palace on the eighth anniversary of his assumption of power that: "The United States wants to send help we say this: Every ship with or without a convoy that approaches Britain will be torpedoed."

"Should those people enter the war Europe will defend itself." He declared: "PARV DICTATION"—Germany has taken into full account the possibility of U. S. aid to Britain.

2. German submarine fleets, air forces and land forces will strike this spring and "force a decision one way or another."

3. Germany has prepared military surprises—"like wonders"—for her opponents.

4. Italy stands firmly at Germany's side, and hopes for revolt in Italy of Germany because of Italian setbacks are vain.

Hitler challenged the British to "show us the weakness of the content from which he asserted, they "have been chased out, but only when they would let me know in advance," he said, "then we would talk the one language they seem to understand."

"The democracies he asserted, are suffering from 'brain paralysis' and can never hope to overcome 'hundreds of millions' people and organize them in the interests of a few little democratic nations."

He said the war will continue but the past year and a half's fighting has practically decided its outcome.

"Everybody knows this who does not wish to falsify the facts," he said, "Germany has never been against American interests. It has fought with them for the liberty of their continent."

Hitler declared that speculation on possibility of an arrangement between Germany and Italy was "foolish."

"If occasional lack of success of our partner is going to convince them Italy is going down they are mistaken."

"The duke and I are neither married nor in love."
