Japan today emphasized continued hope for peace with the U. S. despite Far Eastern fears that war-like moves lie behind her moves in the south Pacific. International attention centered on Japan as relative quiet descended on the western world there. Foreign Minister Yosuke Matsuzaki reiterated his hopes for friendly relations with the U. S. in a diet discussion of Japan's foreign policy. He contended that the tripartite military alliance of Japan, Germany and Italy was not directed at the U. S. and that its prime purpose was to adjust to some Japanese relations.
