NEW YORK, Feb. 6.—(UP)—A few isolated sessions averted the trend of the averages higher for industrials and utilities and slightly lower for the rails in a quiet stock market today.

The industrial average made a gain because of advances of that point or more in Allied Chemical, American Smelting, American Telephone and Telegraph, International Harvester and Johns-Manville. A rise of 1/4 points in Commonwealth & Southern preferred brought a small gain in the utility average, while a 3/4 point decline in Norfolk & Western brought the carrier average down.

PLAYERS BRING DAMAGE ACTION
 Lawsuit was filed yesterday in Kitsap county superior court by Richard and Marian Playter, husband and wife, asking damages totaling \$5,000 from Ralph Pedersen, Kingston.

The complaint alleges the Playters received personal injuries June 23, 1940, when an automobile in which they were riding was struck by Pedersen's car on the highway near the town of Kingston.

The original complaint was served on Pedersen Sept. 9, 1940, and he appeared in court as summoned on Sept. 23, but there have been no proceedings since.

The Playters will ask the \$5,000 judgment by default in court on Monday.

3-BLOCK AREA OF CITY 'SINKS'
 WEST PITTSBURG, Pa., Feb. 6.—(UP)—A three-block area in the heart of West Pittsburg, a community of 7,500 in Pennsylvania's anthracite belt, settled today as underground mine workings gave way.

Between 20 and 40 business establishments and residences were affected. Windows were shattered, plaster cracked and fissures 20 inches deep opened up in the streets, causing water and gas mains to burst.

The West Pittsburg high school, with an attendance of 800, was ordered closed as a precautionary measure.

Japan's New Envoy Welcomed by Navy
 SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 6.—(UP)—Admiral Kichisaburo Nomura, Japan's new ambassador to Washington, arrived in San Francisco today on his way to his post, and expressed confidence present problems between the U. S. and Japan could be settled "amicably and satisfactorily" by diplomacy.

 vote of both houses to become law and that would require the president's signature. Normally congress must pass a repeal bill to revoke existing laws.

The amendment was the first non-administration amendment to be accepted by the house.

Lindy Testifies
 WASHINGTON, Feb. 6.—(UP)—Col. Charles A. Lindbergh today summed up his opposition to the administration's Leahy bill with this statement: "It is this bill in itself that I should fight. I don't think it is our war, so I don't want us to fight it."

Holding that the bill would put this country nearer toward entrance into the war, Lindbergh presented his views to the senate foreign relations committee.

The U. S. air corps is in a "deplorable condition" and is being weakened still more by the present policy of selling much of the present production abroad, he said.

Man Who Figured in Knabb Case Is Held
 SEATTLE, Feb. 6.—(UP)—Edward C. Burns, former Seattle attorney, was arrested yesterday at his Boeing Aircraft Co. plant when he was employed as a flyover, on a federal charge of forgery.

Burns, who was arrested here in 1938 on a conspiracy charge in which the then mayor of Bremerton, Jesse Knabb, figured, is accused of forging the endorsement to a \$500 check issued by the superior court in Spokane, U. S. Commissioner Almon C. Bowman found him over to federal court to \$1,000 bond for removal to Spokane.

 Damage suit asking \$5,750 was filed in Kitsap county superior court this morning by Mrs. Pearl M. Jones on behalf of her son, George, 14, against Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Witt of Colby.

Young Jones assertedly received a broken leg in an automobile collision Jan. 18, 1941, on the Long Islet road, a short distance south of the Harper highway.

The complaint alleges that Witt, then defendant, is 70 years old and has impaired vision and that he failed to keep control of his car and give one-half the highway to the Jones car, in which the injured boy was a passenger.

U. S. COLLECTS STIFF PENALTY
 LOS ANGELES, Feb. 6.—(UP)—Fourteen officials of the Western Pine association, the association itself and 28 lumber companies, pleaded no contest to a fine-trust charges today and were fined a total of \$31,000 by Federal Judge Harry Holtzer.

Twenty-two companies were given suspended sentences.

Thomas Clark, special assistant to the U. S. attorney general, informed the court that all of the defendants had signed a consent decree agreeing to discontinue their practices complained of.

By their no contest pleas, the defendants admitted the actions of which the government accused them, but denied there was any criminal intent.

NAVAL ACADEMY SUPPORT ASKED
 OLYMPIA, Feb. 6.—(UP)—Two memorials on national defense were introduced in the senate today, one asking congress to establish a naval academy in the Puget Sound area.

The measure was sponsored by Sens. Joe Drumheller, Spokane, and Albert D. Rosellini, King. A memorial by Sen. J. P. Keller, Lincoln, urged congress to appropriate money to build a system of "adequate military roads" in Washington.

Sen. Carl C. Mohler, Thurston, filed a bill to put Washington on daylight saving time from the last Sunday in April to the last Sunday in September each year.
