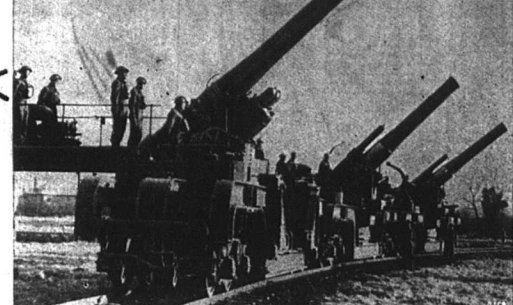

## Senate Hears Condemnation Of F. D.'s Lend-Lease Bill

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10. (UP)—Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge, Rep., Mass., in a certain-raising speech on forthcoming senate debate over the administration's British-aid bill, attacked the measure today as an attempt to establish "internation dictatorship" in the U. S. Lodge spoke at length in the senate as the senate foreign relations committee heard final opposition witnesses. The hearings will close tomorrow with testimony in support of the bill by Wendell L. Willkie and President James B. Conant of Harvard university. Lodge charged that the bill would weaken this nation's power to defend itself against attack and that the transfer of American defense weapons abroad at this time is dangerous because of present armistice restraints.
