What shows what an organized campaign can do in a city. But what can be done for a city, you can do for your own home.

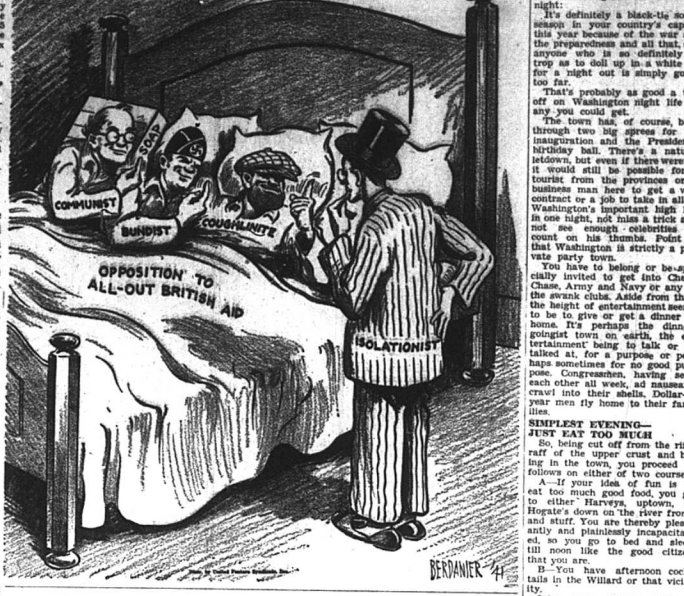
IN HOLLYWOOD
