Great Britain Called 'Aggressor' by Senator Nye

WASHINGTON, March 4. (UP)—Sen. Gerald P. Nye, Rep., N. D., appealed to the senate today to defeat the British aid bill and thus prevent sacrificing "the solvency of our national treasury, the lives of our young men, and even our democratic form of government."

The North Dakotan denounced the pseudo-democracy of the bill, and "the greatest aggressor in the world, the British empire."
