

**Income Tax Returns Double Last Year**  
**TACOMA, March 14.**—(UP)—Income tax returns for 1940 in Washington and Alaska are coming in at more than double last year's rate, Collector of Internal Revenue Clark Squire said today.  
 Bulk of the income was reported from persons not previously affected by the law.  
 Up to today, 146,811 returns were received, while on the corresponding day last year only 68,111 were in.

**DAMAGED SHIPS TOWED TO PORT**  
**ASTORIA, Ore., March 14.**—(UP)—The steam schooner *Rebecca Johnson*, leaking badly and with her rear gunwales awash after losing her rudder in a calm sea six miles southwest of Grays Harbor, was towed into the Columbia river today.  
 The 1,104-ton vessel reached the river's mouth in the town of the tug *Arthur Fox* of Seattle at 9 a. m. The *Rebecca Johnson* came down the coast under her own power with pumps working and was picked up by the *Fox* off the mouth.  
 Longshoremen immediately began removing the ship's lumber cargo.  
 Captain C. Anderson said the vessel struck the bottom in crossing Grays Harbor bar and sprung a leak immediately. Engineers said water began coming in the engine room.  
 Marine examiners will survey the damage today and the ship will probably be towed to Portland for repairs.

**RECEIVED**  
 Diplomatic sources in Belgrade reported that the British have landed 200,000 troops at Pirana, the Port of Albania. The United States heard through private advice from abroad two days ago that a British expeditionary force had arrived in Greece.  
 There has been neither official confirmation nor denial of a B. E. F. landing in Greece.  
 If the British have landed in Greece, it was not expected that German troops now massed to the number of 200,000 or so in south Bulgaria would long delay action.  
 The Turks hinted today that if Jugoslavia resists Axis hand-laid, Turkey may not only support Greece but also the Jugoslavia against aggression. London heard that Russia has assured Turkey that she will abide by a 1928 treaty insuring her neutrality in event of a German or Italian-German attack on Turkey.

C.**—(UP)—The city council has passed a new ordinance which provides that any dog which bites a person while the animal is off its owner's property shall be seized and executed at the pound. The "vicious dog ordinance" provides a \$100 fine or 30 days in jail for any person attempting to interfere with police when they seek to catch the dog.
