Australia Told of U. S. War-Aid Plan

STYDNEY, Australia, March 20.—(UP)—Rear Admiral John H. Newton, commanding the American naval squadron which arrived today, told Australians tonight that "America never before has been so ready and willing to throw its energies into helping the democracies win the war."

The arrival of the seven American "cruisers" was hailed as a "crisis" gave Sydney one of its greatest moments since the war was news of the front pages of newspapers for the first time since hostilities started.

Newton spoke at a dinner tendered by the federal government.

No Argentine Beef for U. S. Navy

WASHINGTON, March 20.—(UP)—Because Vice President Henry A. Wallace was not present to cast a deciding vote, the administration today lost its effort in the senate to remove present restrictions regarding the navy to buy farm products grown outside the U. S.

The senate voted 32 to 32 on an amendment to the navy appropriation bill which would have lifted the restriction. It was Wallace's first opportunity to break a tie since he became vice president on Jan. 20, and he could have decided the issue in favor of the administration.

He was not on hand, and so under senate rules the tie meant that the amendment was defeated. Wallace's office reported that he was at lunch at the time.

Sec. Allen J. Ellender, Dem. La., who was presiding at the time, voted with the administration.

The controversial amendment centered around the navy's desire to buy some Argentine canned beef. Western senators fought the plan on the ground it would turn over domestic cattle raisers' markets to the South American, although previously the defense commission had announced that cattle interests had agreed to permit purchase of some Argentine beef for the army and navy.

Fear Girl Drowned In Canoe Mishap

SEATTLE, March 20.—(UP)—The harbor patrol today searched Lake Washington for the body of pretty Margerie Templeton, 20-year-old Wenatchee girl, believed to have drowned in a canoe accident yesterday which cost the life of William F. L. Goss, 22.

Goss' body was recovered beside the capsized collapsible kayak a few hours after he and Miss Templeton ventured out in a windstorm against the advice of a canoeman.

Miss Templeton, a restaurant waitress, has not been seen since Goss' home was in Zillah and they were childhood friends.

Affects Boeing Co.

SEATTLE, March 20.—(UP)—A strike at Harvard Die Casting Corp. in Eaglewood, Cal., may shortly affect production of the navy's huge flying fortresses and speedy dive bombers, a Boeing Aircraft Co. spokesman said.

The company is now awaiting delivery of many "critical items" from Harvard, he said.

No Graduation at Annapolis This June
