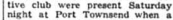

War-Aid Measure Being Sent to F. D. R.

WASHINGTON, March 25.—(UP)—Speaker Sam Rayburn and Vice President Henry A. Wallace signed the \$7,000,000,000 war-

aid appropriation bill today, and arrangements were completed for its delivery to President Roosevelt by airplane.

The president's signature will free the huge appropriation for the purchase of planes, ships, tanks, guns and food for Great Britain and perhaps other nations fighting the Axis.

Rayburn signed the record appropriation in the presence of the house soon after it convened at noon. It was then sent to Wallace's office on the senate side of the capitol.
