

### War-Aid Bill Gets F. D. R. Signature

**ABOARD U.S. DESTROYER BREMERTON, March 27. (UP)—** President Roosevelt today signed the \$7,000,000 war-aid appropriation bill, an act which starts the stream of aid-out-of-war planes, ships, tanks, guns and food to Great Britain and her allies. He signed the bill as soon as it was flown to the White House. The bill is a part of the Lend-Lease Act, which is enabling the United States to furnish aid to the Allies in the form of military equipment, food, clothing, and other supplies. The bill is the first of a series of bills which will be passed during the session of the 76th Congress. It is expected that the bill will be passed by the end of the month.

### President of Molders' Union Visits

Union leaders in Puget Sound navy yards are determined to obtain wage adjustments immediately. It was reported today by the International Molders Union, Local No. 171 of Bremerton. At a special meeting held last night at the Laker Hotel, union leaders heard Harry Stevenson of Cincinnati, O., international president of the I. M. U., who made a brief visit to Bremerton. He was introduced by Richard Scott, president of the local. Stevenson discussed wage and hour conditions prevailing for molders throughout the nation. A recent survey of 128 molders, he asserted, revealed that less than one-half of the molders and core-makers are holding first-class ratings, except in the Bremerton yard, where the first-class rate is more prevalent. The Molders' Union, it was disclosed, will call upon the Metal Trades Council of Bremerton to urge reworking of the wage board by the navy department. If the council does not take the lead in this matter, the union itself will present data to navy officials to show that wage discrepancies exist. The I. M. U. particularly desires elimination of second class ratings for workmen. Contracts being negotiated by foundry workers in private industry were discussed by Stevenson in detail. A compromise agreement with foundry operators has been drafted, he said, calling for a 10-cent per hour wage increase by July 1 and a 10-cent increase by May 1. The contract is subject to approval of the union membership. The Molders' Union is now 82 years old. Stevenson pointed out at the present time, a small one strike is in progress, a only one at present, III. He praised the U. S. guarantee of labor bargaining rights and called for preservation of the right of free speech.
