Beck Raps Lindbergh for Anti-Semitism

DAVE BECK, international vice president of the Transmitters union, accused Charles A. Lindbergh in a radio address last night in Seattle of trying to divide the American people with anti-semitic speeches.

"If we start fighting each other we are lost," Beck said. "Lindbergh was thus far, because his enemies are divided."

He will continue to win as long as people listen to men like Lindbergh.

Beck said Lindbergh's attack on Jews in Des Moines, Ia., last week was an invitation for the Ku Klux Klan to ride again.

"We want no men in the night suit like a German Gestapo," Beck said. "It is to fight against such things that we are sending our boys to army camps."
