Unable to provide their cars because of a growing reluctance on the part of their husbands since the rationing and consequent tire shortage, the motor corps members are starting a campaign to purchase a station wagon, it is announced by Miss Virginia A. Kinnear.

Nearly \$300 has already been pledged to the fund by the hull and machinery of the motor corps. The ladies have willingly been giving their time and energy, and are now making plans to transport members, stretchers, poles, cots, surgical dressings, medical supplies and packs, large bundles of clothing, yarn and even babies to all points in the county.

The emergency ambulance drivers receive thorough training. A difficult course in motor mechanics, traffic regulations, first aid, advanced first aid, a section at a repair shop, a driving test, supervised by the state patrol, a physical examination and 18 probationary hours must be completed to qualify for membership.

Value of State's Farm Crop Climbs

OLYMPIA, Feb. 18.—(UP)—Value of Washington's farm crops showed a tremendous increase in 1941, amounting 64 per cent above 1940, according to survey by the state and federal departments of agriculture.

Total value last year was estimated at \$184,659,000, compared to \$100,989,000 for 1940. Counting in livestock and livestock products, the grand total for last year reached \$296,948,000.

The survey showed Washington produced \$92,880,000 worth of livestock and allied products in 1941, \$108,740,000 in field crops, \$48,631,000 in fruit, nut and berry crops and \$8,688,000 in vegetable crops.

The crop of greatest value in the state in 1941 is wheat, totaling \$32,800,000. Income from milk would rank second with \$42,600,000. Apples rank third with \$31,180,000.

Some of the lesser known crops made similar increases in value. Hemp doubled to \$4,529,000, peppermint oil production went up from \$27,000 to \$140,000 and cranberries up from \$277,000 to \$500,000.
