Civil Authorities Relinquish Soldier Lawbreakers to Army

Jurisdiction over U. S. army men stationed in this county, in the matter of misdemeanors and gross misdemeanors, has been relinquished to military authorities by Prosecuting Attorney Fred B. Cohen, the prosecutor revealed today.

Model Plane Building Set In County

A. L. Vann-Watson, county superintendent of schools, today reported the following instructions in regard to model aircraft project.

There are three centers designated in the county, with directors in each. They are: Bremerton public schools, Helms Madison; North Kitsap high school, Foulson; H. W. Herrichman; and South Kitsap high school, Port Orford, Maynard Lundberg.

Plans and specifications for the model planes have been sent by the U. S. office of education to these schools.

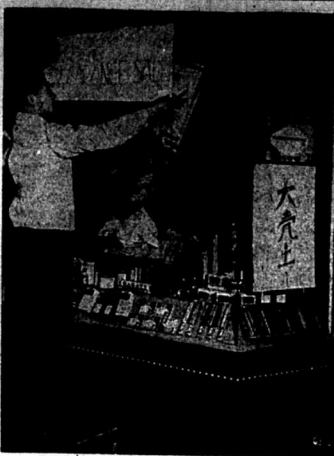
Shop instructors in schools not designated as centers should contact the local director in the nearest model aircraft project school, where they may borrow models and plans.

Each local director will accept the responsibility of sending at least one perfect model plane to the U. S. air base, Seattle.

All schools in the county and non-school groups should be encouraged to participate. It is recommended that assisting groups or service clubs be organized to give assistance.

The model planes will be scale designs of real aircraft, and will be displayed to acquaint the general public with the silhouette of enemy planes.

Each local director will accept the responsibility of sending at least one perfect model plane to the U. S. air base, Seattle.

Will Open Offices To Handle Property Of Japs and Aliens

SAN FRANCISCO, March 12 (UP)—The Federal Bank of San Francisco today put into immediate operation its program for caring for property of Japanese, German and Italian who are to be evacuated from the Pacific coast defense zone. An office was opened here and arrangements

were made to open offices in other cities having large alien populations.

The establishment of the alien property control offices was a preliminary to removal of 120,000 Japanese aliens and citizens and of many German and Italian aliens from the coastal area. Removal orders, probably affecting large cities first, are expected shortly from the office of Lieut. Gen. John L. DeWitt, commanding the western defense zone.

All-Out Jap Drive Expected in Burma

CHUNGKING, March 12.—(UP)—Chinese military experts here believe today Japan now was ready

to start a full-scale all-out offensive against all of Burma. They said the relative ease with which the Nippon army achieved its Malaya and Dutch East Indies objectives left it free to launch the Burma offensive without the mor-

mal campaign breathing spell. Chinese experts said Japan's expenditure of war materials, supplies and manpower in China had been much less than anticipated and huge stocks were available for the Burma drive.
