

Preparedness In Homes to Be Stressed

Seeking to get incendiary bomb-fighting equipment assembled in every family, the Bremerton defense council and Kitsap county defense council today announced plans for Home Protection Week to be observed March 29 through April 5. The observance will be sponsored by the state defense council.

Air raid wardens will visit all homes in their neighborhoods during the week to award "home preparedness" certificates to families which have their equipment and to urge other households to prepare. The certificate will be suitable for home window display. Wardens also will be in distribution during the Home Protection Week of official air raid instructions, bearing the standard instructions to citizens.

Homes will receive window cards only if their wardens are satisfied that they have enough equipment—sand bucket, garden hose, fire extinguisher, etc.—to fight incendiary bombs. At simultaneous meetings of air raid wardens throughout the state Saturday night, March 28, Home Protection Week will be launched with wardens receiving sample copies of the A.R.P. posters and certificates. Final instructions to the wardens will be given over a state-wide radio program during the meeting.

Burmester Places In Oratorical Event, Enters State Meet

Ed Burmaster, silver-tongued orator of Bremerton high school, will enter the state finals of the American Oratorical contest at Yakima March 28.

Young Burmaster won second place in the western Washington sectional competition at the Seattle civic auditorium annex Saturday afternoon. Previously, he had taken first place in the Bremerton, county and district contests, sponsored by the American Legion auxiliaries.

Six finalists—three from western and three from eastern Washington—will compete in the state contest. Two of Burmaster's opponents will be Irving Hamden, of Seattle, who took first place in the sectional meet, and Jimmy Moriarty, Tacoma, Saturday's third-place winner.
