State Reduces Speed Limit To 40 M.P.H.

Forty miles an hour is the limit in Washington state highways today, by order of Gov. Arthur R. Langlie, who became the first governor in the far west to act on President Roosevelt's suggestion to conserve rubber by cutting speed limits.

Langlie issued the order last night, effective at midnight.

Throughout the state, changes in speed signs were begun, on order of State Highway Director Burwell Smith.

Langlie asked county commissioners to fix a 40 m.p.h. speed limit on county roads, but state county commissioners had "beat him to the gun". They set such a limit in towns and populous areas.

Evacuation of Aliens, Japs Will Start

SAN FRANCISCO, March 18—(UP)—The army disclosed plans today to begin evacuation of 120,000 aliens and American-born Japanese from the Pacific Coast next week in a move to forestall possible fifth column activity.

One thousand Los Angeles families, aliens and American-born Japanese who have volunteered for the evacuation movement, will travel by train, bus and automobile to reception centers under construction at Manzanar, in the Owens valley, 200 miles to the north.

Ultimately they may become members of a work-armor which was established yesterday by President Roosevelt in an executive order. Where the will be housed had not been determined.

Last Gen. John L. DeWitt, commanding the western defense command, announced the evacuation would begin from military area No. 1, an area roughly 100 miles deep along the coast of Washington, Oregon and California and the southern section of Arizona.

"While the 1,000 leaving next week are cooperating and have volunteered to be the first to go," said DeWitt, "evacuation from the certain areas will continue."

"I encourage and urge the continuation of such movements as this first group has started. However, I desire to make it unmistakably clear that evacuation will be continued with or without such cooperation."
