

Girls in Australia Catching Fancy of American Soldiers

MACARTHUR'S HEADQUARTERS IN AUSTRALIA, March 26.—(UP)—Gen. Douglas MacArthur soon may be asked to take time out from his pressing military duties to decide whether American soldiers should continue to be permitted to marry Australian girls.

The marriages have caused a delicate strategic issue directly into the laps of MacArthur and his staff, and some "official" stand may be forthcoming.

While certain Australian leaders are hinted strongly today that a marriage "ban" should be imposed at least for the duration, an American army headquarters spokesman revealed that no instructions had been issued forbidding American service men to marry Australian girls.

No estimate of the possible number of marriages is possible because many couples have been married secretly. The number married publicly has been described as "considerable" and Australian records show a steady increase.

Materials for Planes Still Short of Need

NEW YORK, March 26.—(UP)—Inability of aircraft manufacturers to obtain adequate supplies of critical materials is retarding American warplane production, Col. John H. Jouett, president of the Aeronautical Chamber of Commerce of America, said yesterday.

"There is only one thing holding back the industry from great production," he said. "It is lack of enough critical materials, parts and other equipment which our manufacturers must have in order to turn out a complete plane in flyaway condition."

Addressing an army air corps luncheon, Jouett said the shortage was not only in such raw materials as aluminum and nickel, but also in "fabricated items such as forgings, extrusions and the hundreds of highly machined parts."

He said labor shortage is not a factor in the restricted plane production, asserting that aircraft manufacturers have been able to reduce from one-third to one-half the average number of man hours required to complete a plane.

Despite the shortages, Jouett said, aircraft plants are ahead of schedules set for them by the government.

A new fabric made from the short fibers of redwood bark combined with wool will be manufactured.

7,141 Aliens Being Held, Says Biddle

WASHINGTON, March 26.—(UP)—Attorney General Francis Biddle announced today that 7,141 enemy aliens have been apprehended by the Federal Bureau of Investigation since the Pearl Harbor attack Dec. 7.

The total included 4,632 Japanese, 2,143 Germans and 966 Italians. Seized in the last week were 97 Japanese, 11 Germans and 196 Italians.

Strikers Sought to Destroy Rail Bridge, Witness Testifies

PEORIA, March 26.—(UP)—William Wheeler, an investigator for the former private management of the government-owned Toledo Peoria and Western Railroad, testified yesterday in federal court that strikers paid him \$1,270 on his promise to dynamite a bridge and tie up vital freight shipments. "So that the government would take over the road," Wheeler testified in the trial of three men charged with violating a federal injunction prohibiting violence in the prolonged strike which resulted in seizure of the 228-mile freight line last Saturday.
