Army Directs Evacuation; Residents Of Island Will Go to California

The army removed every Japanese from Bainbridge Island today in four hours, clearing the vital area of 227 alien and American-born farmers.

The enforced evacuation moved with military precision. Bainbridge Island, part of Kitsap county, is the site of a naval radio station and is on the main water route from Puget Sound navy yard to Seattle.

Relax Regulations on Germans, Italians
BREMERTON, March 26.—(UP)—Bremerton orders for German and Italian aliens were relaxed today in a proclamation issued by Lt. Col. M. C. DeWitt, commanding the western defense command and the fourth military division.

There was no easing of regulations, however, against Japanese aliens. Their American-born children.

DeWitt's proclamation today established an exemption from internment for German and Italian aliens over 60 years of age.

German and Italian aliens who are parents of children are exempt from internment.
