

Navy Aircraft Rescues 17 Ship Survivors

WASHINGTON, April 15.—(UP)—The navy revealed today that at least one woman, who had drifted for 80 hours on a 10-foot raft in the waters south of Haiti after their ship was torpedoed, have been rescued by an airplane heavily loaded with California naval patrol planes.

The dramatic rescue was disclosed in the official report of Ensign Francis E. Punter, pilot of the patrol plane, which did not land near the plane's heavy depth charges to lighten the load as he had hoped he might sight an enemy submarine crossing Windward Passage.

His commanding officer, who forwarded the account to Vice Admiral Royal R. Ingersoll, commander-in-chief of the Atlantic fleet, praised the highest degree of skill and seamanship and "in keeping with the finest tradition of the naval service."

Punter, 35-year-old naval reservist, is from Bechtel, Wash. The plane, which has a normal crew of seven, was so heavily loaded with eight navy men, the 17 survivors and its anti-submarine charges that when Punter finally got it into the air it required 20 minutes to climb to 500 feet.

The action occurred March 9.

Stuart Chase Sees 'Mixed' Social Order

WASHINGTON, April 15.—(UP)—Stuart Chase, well-known economist and writer, predicts a modified system of free enterprise for America after the war is over—a "mixed" economy in which private enterprise works with public works and government controls.

In a special report for the Twentieth Century Fund entitled "The Road We Are Traveling: 1914-42," Chase contends that economic challenges to democracy is not so much military in the long run, as it is social.

Chase defines the following specific objectives of the program:

1. Full employment. All men and women seeking work which cannot be found in private industry should be employed by the state.
2. Full and prudent use of material resources. "Idle plants must become as great a scandal as idle men."
3. A guarantee of five essentials to every citizen—food, housing, clothing, health, education.
4. Labor standards, including minimum wage, maximum hours, and standards for working conditions.
5. Social insurance including old-age allowances, benefits for sickness and disability, temporary unemployment and childbearing.

Japanese Ousted From Alaska by Military Orders

SEATTLE, April 15.—(UP)—All Japanese in Alaska, both alien and American-born, must report to military posts in the territory by April 20 for removal to the continental limits of the U. S., according to the Anchorage Times, received here today.

Major Gen. Simon B. Buckner Jr., commanding general of the Alaska defense command, issued the proclamation calling for the removal of all Japanese from Alaska, the Times said.

In issuing the proclamation, Gen. Buckner declared Alaska "a military area which requires every possible protection against espionage and sabotage against national defense material premises and utilities."

Historic Seedling Will Be Planted At Capitol Museum

OLYMPIA, April 15.—(UP)—The state capital museum today has acquired a seedling tree, grown from seeds of the famous Robert Gray spruce which for decades guided mariners into Grays harbor.

When the spruce was blown down a couple years ago, only a few cones were saved and from those but 15 seedlings grew. The cones were given to the state forestry division, which sprouted the seeds in the capital nursery.

The museum will plant the seedling in the grounds around it. The mother tree was named for Robert Gray, discoverer of Grays harbor. It stood alone and sent spit at the harbor mouth.

Maury Maverick Speaks in Seattle

SEATTLE, April 15.—(UP)—Former Congressman Maury Maverick of Texas will speak at a meeting of the association of city officials of Washington May 7-8, it was announced today by Secretary John E. Carroll.

Maverick is now head of the municipal division of the Federal priorities board. He will meet city officials of Washington state to discuss war problems.

Boy Starts Costly Blaze By Accident

JANESVILLE, Wis., April 15.—(UP)—Police Captain Earl Hoffmann announced that an eight-year-old boy confessed yesterday he accidentally started a \$1,000, 400 fire which raged for eight hours through an entire business block.

The blaze burned large business buildings in the heart of Janesville, despite efforts of six fire departments. Three buildings were destroyed, three were badly damaged and three firemen were injured.

Discovery by the boy's mother that he had merchandise from the W. T. Grant store in which the fire started, led to the confession, Hoffmann said.

The boy had a flashlight and personal checkbook of Robert Young, manager of the store, police said.

Hoffmann said the boy told of entering the store through a fire door after closing time, lighting a match and, lighting it into a waste paper basket.
