Bremerton high school's new football coach is Dwight Scheyer, former North Kitsap coach, who resigned recently after 11 years at the helm of the Bremerton team.

The six-foot four-inch 220-pound Scheyer, an all-county tackle at Washington State college in his playing days, began his high school coaching career at North Kitsap in Poulbo in the fall of 1930.
