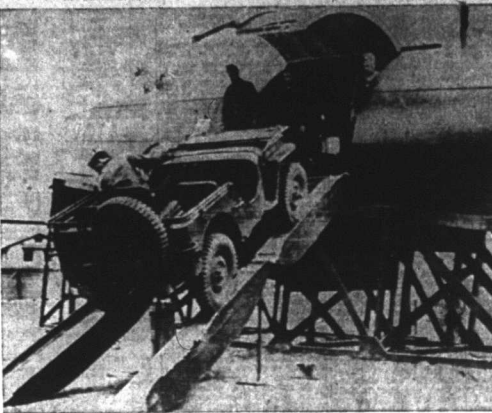
General Wavell Takes to Ether in War of Nerves

WAR ON BURMA

GREAT CASUALTIES
