**Navy Relief Society Benefit
Opens New Admiral Theater**

Luxurious New Showhouse to Be
Dedicated Tonight by Premiere

Bremerton's new, luxurious theater, The Admiral, opens tonight with a benefit performance for the Navy Relief society.

Entire proceeds of tonight's benefit premiere showing of Cecil B. DeMille's great new production, "Reap the Wild Wind," will be turned over to the Navy Relief society. Only one performance, starting at 8:15 o'clock is scheduled; all seats are reserved. Tomorrow, the Admiral starts its regular policy of presenting first-run pictures from Hollywood's major studios. The first production will be "The Fleet's In," a

massive comedy-drama starring Dorothy Lamour, Eddie Bracken and William Holden. Among those to be in attendance at tonight's gala opening of the Admiral will be Rear Admiral and Mrs. Taffinder and Capt. L. E. Kimball of Puget Sound navy yard; Frank L. Newman and Al Rosenberg, Seattle, president and vice president, respectively of Evergreen Theaters. The theater was constructed by the Ocean Amusement Co. of Bremerton, which is affiliated with Evergreen Theaters. Also operated by Ocean are the Rialto and Rex theaters here.

The new Admiral theater has 224 seats, is tastefully finished with pastel shades and is equipped with E-T Simplex projection equipment and an exceptionally large screen. A large lobby, foyer, smoking rooms and rest rooms also are provided in the attractive structure.

Several business shops also will soon open for business on the ground floor level of the theater building. Dedication of the theater tonight will be accomplished without benefit of lengthy speeches, etc. The dedication is presented on a special trailer supplied by a major Hollywood studio; it will be shown throughout the week.

L. L. Peterson is manager of the theater and also will retain management of the Rialto and Rex theaters. Esther McDougall and Lola Stewart will greet the Admiral patrons in the box-office, and a trained staff of usherettes also has been employed.

The Admiral, starting tomorrow, will present performances continuous from 12 noon daily. The Rialto will continue on a first-run picture policy, continuous from 8 p.m. daily, and the Admiral and Rialto admission prices will be the same.

**R.A.F. Pilot Dies as
Auto Hits Grader**

VANCOUVER, Wash., May 7. (UP)—Reginald James Osborne, 29, R.A.F. pilot, of Surrey, England, was killed and three other service men, were injured last night in an auto accident near Pioneer on the Pacific highway. All four of the men were on leave and had been given a ride by Theodore E. Jensen, 31, Ingleside, Cal.

The car smashed sideways into a heavy road grader. Osborne was killed almost instantly while the others were treated at Vancouver barracks.
