

Work Saving Dishes that fit into crowded days

An easy dish for a busy day is Savory Ham, with Cheese Biscuit Top.

THESE are busy days for all of us, and among the things being discarded with great cheerfulness are elaborate dishes. Nowadays we want honest foods, simply prepared. But that doesn't mean dull foods. No, indeed! Quite the contrary. Consider these two War-time favorites, for example. Biscuits, of keen relishing flavor, they are easy to prepare and they deliver a full quota of nourishment!

- Savory Ham with Cheese Biscuit Top**
- 1 tablespoon onion, chopped
 - 1 tablespoon green pepper, chopped
 - 1 tablespoon butter
 - 1 tablespoon flour
 - 1 cup condensed chicken soup
 - 1 cup milk
 - 1 cup hash, dried
 - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- Cook onion and green pepper in butter until soft, but not browned. Add flour and heat and stir until frothy. Then add the chicken soup and milk and cook until thick and smooth. Add sliced ham and lemon juice. Pour into a buttered casserole and arrange cheese biscuits on top. Bake in hot oven (400°) 15 minutes. Then reduce oven heat to 350° and bake until biscuits are golden brown or about 15 minutes longer. Serves 6.
- Cheese Biscuit Top:**
Mix together 1/4 cup prepared biscuit flour and 1/2 cup grated cheese. Add 4 tablespoons of milk and mix until a medium soft dough is formed. Roll out on a floured board and cut with biscuit or doughnut cutter. Arrange biscuits on top of "Savory Ham Pie" and bake in the oven.
- Just two ingredients in these meat loaves—and they're delicious: Individual Beef and Vegetable Loaves
- 1 pound ground beef
1 cup condensed vegetable soup
- Combine the ground beef and soup and mix well. Pack into large size muffin pans and bake in a moderate oven (350°) for 45 minutes to one hour. Serves 24.

U. S. Builds 100 Airdromes In Australia

MELBOURNE, June 24.—(UP)—At least 100 military airdromes have been built in Australia. Thousands of miles of strategic roads have been built or improved and 11,000 separate projects are now under way in a gigantic program of construction by the allied works council and the U. S. army engineer corps. It was announced today.

One giant airdrome, costing nearly \$10,000,000, was built in 71 days.

Brig. Gen. Hugh Casey of the engineer corps revealed the vast program today.

Gen. Casey said that the work was well in hand despite shortage of labor, plants and machinery because the defense organization was using such bare essentials as it had to deal with the immediate situation.

The face of Australia is being changed by the construction of the airfield, which entails excavating the difficult ground by variations in the width of railroad gages and the lack of roads through the interior.

Road building ranks second only to airdrome construction, Casey said, and road construction of the Australian states are co-operating with U. S. engineer units.

Japs Hold Secret Meetings At Santa Anita; 4 Arrested

LOS ANGELES, June 24.—(UP)—Six Japanese aliens faced imprisonment for the duration of the war today because they allegedly held secret meetings conducted in Japanese language at Santa Anita Assembly Center.

The aliens were arrested by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and removed from the center, the War-time Civil Control Administration announced. Five Japanese-Americans also were being questioned by the F. B. I. and may be prosecuted in federal court.

Sharp Decline In 'Gas' Consumption

OLYMPIA, June 24.—(UP)—Licensing Director Thomas A. Swayne reported today. Washington's motorists were using approximately 4,000,000 gallons of gasoline less per month this year than they used in 1941.

Swayne blamed the rubber shortage which had caused many motorists to sell or store their cars, and the threat of gasoline rationing, for the decrease.

The report said 13,138,630 gallons were distributed by 36 oil companies during May, 1943, compared with 38,596,000 distributed one year ago.
