

Yard Needs More Women To Fill Jobs

Puget Sound navy yard is making a special effort to employ women of Bremerton and vicinity—women who are residents of the community and whose domestic duties will not prevent them from accepting war production work.

The attention of such prospective yard employes was directed by yard officials today to examinations for machine learners, male as well as female, which will be held by the civil service commission beginning Sept. 12, 8:30 a. m., at the Bremerton high school. Applications can be filed at the time of examination.

Those who pass the examination and who are physically quali-

fied will be given opportunities for employment in the yard, naval ammunition depot or naval torpedo station, Keyport.

Prefers Jail Term To Army Service

SEATTLE, Sept. 10.—(UP)—John L. Barber, 24, Phoenix, Ariz., told U.S. Commissioner Harry M. Westfall yesterday that he would rather go to jail than enlist in the army.

Barber, who said he came to Seattle from Phoenix seeking work as a druggist, explained he was a conscientious objector to all that war stands for. He was bound over to federal authorities.
