

PRESSURE TIGHTENS ON ITALY; BRITISH PLANES DEAL BLOWS TO TURIN

Allies Anticipate Difficult Task To Overcome Axis in Tunis Area

American, British and French forces today moved to-ward a final showdown with the axis in North Africa. Converging allied columns drove on Tunis, Bizerte and Gabes where German and Italian troops were entrenching themselves for a last-ditch battle.
