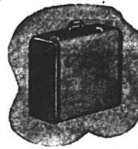

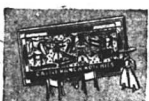

L. A. Prep Students Get 2-Week Holiday
LOS ANGELES, Dec. 3—(UP)—Ninety thousand Los Angeles high school students will begin their Christmas vacations a week early next Monday to relax from work during the holiday rush at the postoffice and in downtown stores.

The board of education made the announcement at the same time word was received from Washington that releasing children from school to help holiday rush jobs is a violation of federal law.

Slayer Committed To State Hospital
PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 3—(UP)—Eugene E. Gabriel, 36-year-old confederator, who allegedly shot and killed a customer Aug. 15, was pronounced insane by alienists and will be committed to the state hospital at Salem, District Attorney James R. Bain said today.

Gabriel was to have gone on trial this month on a first degree murder charge as a result of the shooting of Elio W. Ellis, a customer. Gabriel was also charged with shooting his wife in a policeman's office before he was arrested. Both Mrs. Gabriel and the officer have recovered.
