LARGE CROWD IS EXPECTED

SAN BENITO, Dec. 9.—Out for revenge for a hard-fought narrow loss to the Eagles in the season, the Brownsville high school team will come here Monday night for a test against the San Benito Greyscholars in a charity benefit game.

The Eagles, who finished third in District 15-A, are anxious to wipe out the blot of San Benito's one-touchdown win over them in a regularly scheduled game. The Brownsville squad, which finished second in the Valley "B" grid class, will be out to prove that their earlier win was no fluke.

The Eagles will have two "all A" District players to lose at the opposition—Xavier Quintero at halfback and Ray Garcia at center—and the Browns have five "all B" District performers to lose in place of the captain Lester Parker, who is left tackle. 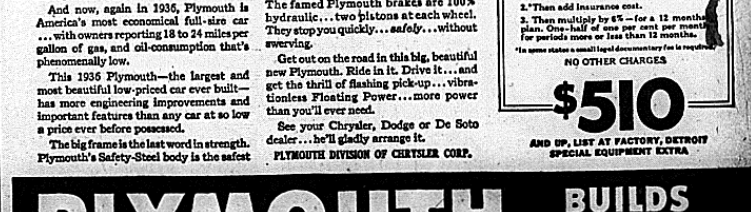
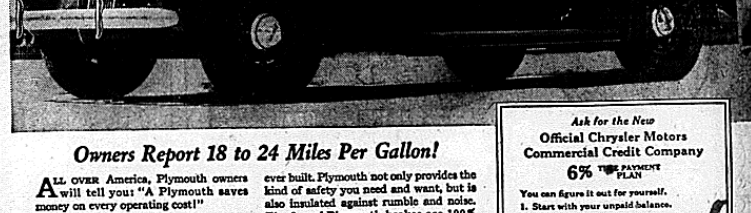
