

Nazis Gassed, Burned Over Million Lublin Prisoners

LUBLIN, POLAND, Aug. 27 (Delayed) — (UP)—More than 2,500,000 men, women and children were killed in special gas chambers or cremated at the German Majdanek concentration camp, a Polish and Russian committee investigating the camp said today.

Chambers dotted the camp, established in 1941 ostensibly for committee and bodies of prisoners were piled on a metal slab, set and pushed into a furnace.

In another part of the camp were gas chambers with fitted metal doors, peroboles and pipes through which the investigating committee said poison gas was introduced in the chambers. Some chambers obviously were intended for carbon monoxide and others showed evidence of both carbon monoxide and prussic acid.

Outside, there were burial pits for the bodies of the victims, and piles of bones filled with tiny bits of bones were scattered throughout the camp.

Production of Aluminum Cut

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 30.—(UP)—Government-owned aluminum plants at Troutdale, Ore., and Spokane today were ordered to cut back their production nine million pounds a month as part of a War Production Board order from Washington ordering a national monthly cutback in eight plants \$2,000,000 worth of aluminum production.

Production of aluminum in eight plants will be reduced at Vancouver, Wash., although WPA officials said the reduction figures were not yet set.

The cut at Spokane will amount to 6,000,000 pounds while the Troutdale cutback totals 3,000,000 pounds of ingot per month.

Mystery Blast Jars Both Channel Coasts

FOLKSTONE, Eng., Aug. 30.—(UP)—The greatest explosion of the war was set off by the French rocket coast last night and the British wondered today if the marine had made an abortive attempt to launch their new V-2 rocket bomb.

The detonation was accompanied by a tremendous rushing noise. Houses on the English coast were shaken, crockery was sent skidding across floors and a few windows were broken. There never had been anything comparable heard in this area. The explosion seemed like an earthquake.
