

American Jews Assail Lindy

NEW YORK (AP)—The American Jewish committee and the Jewish labor committee denouncing Charles A. Lindbergh's Des Moines speech, asserted Thursday night in a joint statement that "our interests and those of our country are one and indivisible."

Declaring that Lindbergh "made an unsupported and unsupportable charge impugning the patriotism of Americans of Jewish faith," the statement said:

'As individuals, each one of us has a right to his views, whether for or against isolationism, without fear that Mr. Lindbergh can intimidate any of us with the low and baseless charge that there are other 'interests' which we place ahead of loyalty to our country.

"In fact, Mr. Lindbergh, in order to secure converts for his own point of view, counsels that we should do just that. He warns Jews to support his policy on the ground that any other attitude would lead to anti-semitism.

"We are obliged to Mr. Lindbergh for his gratuitous advice and reject completely his un-American appeal to selfish interest."
