

Nazis Will Not Boycott Jews

BERLIN, Sept. 18.—(AP)—Jewish merchants in Germany took heart today from indirect recognition by the Nazi trade and industry organization that their business play a vital role in the third reich's economic life.

The organization, considered generally as staunchly supporting Julius Streicher, leader of the Nazi anti-Semitic movement, appealed to Aryan members not to boycott Jewish shops. Pamphlets addressed to Jewish tradesmen asked them to resume relations with Aryan dealers.

This action, in the face of the recent reichstag anti-Jewish legislation, came as a surprise to many Aryan shop-owners who believed the end of Jewish stores in Germany was only a matter of time.

Although hardly two days had passed since the enactment of the new anti-Semitic laws, they were being felt already by Jewish employers of Aryan domestic help.

Paragraph III of the law "for protection of blood and honor" does not become effective until Jan. 1, 1936, ruling that Jews may not employ Aryan women under 45 years of age as domestics, but many gentile maids were preparing to leave their positions in Jewish households.

A private investigation among Jewish families in Berlin disclosed that a great number of women servants were seeking new jobs on their off-days. Many were successful.
