

General Motors Corp.

Will Assure 187,000 Of Weekly Incomes

Plans Will Give Hourly And Salaried Workers 60 Per Cent Of Standard Wages During Layoffs

Nov. 14—(AP)—General Motors Corp. announced benefit plans, effective in 1939, intended to give fully 150,000 hourly wage employes within the states the economic security of assured weekly

P. Sloan, Jr., chairman of the corporation, said plan applicable to 37,000 salaried employes would be adopted soon.

Hourly workers with five years of service will be given the "General Motors Security Plan," under which the corporation will advance to each employe in periods of curtailed employment an amount sufficient to give him 60 per cent of his normal weekly income.

New York, Nov. 14—(AP)—A proposal that the United States sever diplomatic relations with Germany if the Reich continues abuse of Jews was made by Senator William H. King (D-Utah) tonight. He and five other leaders of politics and religion protested what they called the barbarism of the Nazis.

Speaking on a nation-wide radio (CBS) symposium, Secretary of the Interior Ickes warned Germany, "no nation can live unto itself alone. The time comes when neither man nor Nation can live without the decent respect of their fellow men."

Former President Herbert Hoover declared Nazi leaders were "bringing to Germany moral isolation from the entire world."

Alfred M. Landon, former Governor of Kansas and 1936 Republican nominee for President, added a warning that "there is a real

that President Roosevelt will issue a statement Tuesday dealing with Germany's treatment of Jews and urging that the Reich Government desist from measures which have shocked the entire world.

Officials denied that Wilson's recall was the first step in a diplomatic breach. It was learned on high authority, however, that Wilson's stay here will be prolonged and that it is improbable he will return unless the Hitler Government recognizes the Semitic question as a problem that requires humanitarian consideration.

Wilson is expected to sail almost immediately. State Department officials did not deny his return a recall, as such, but said he had been ordered here "for consultation." Twice before—in 1870 and 1872—the United States

exhibited its displeasure over maltreatment of Jews by using such tactics.

The German Embassy here had no knowledge of this move until advised by the United Press. At
