Members of the panel were the Rev. Samuel M. Donovan of St. Christopher's Church, Peaks Island, Professor Ebridge Sibley of Bowdoin College, Rabbi Mendall Lewittes of Portland and Richard A. Hebert, president of the Portland Newspaper Guild.

The panel differed, however, on the best method of stimulating the public to think. Rabbi Lewittes and Professor Sibley agreed that school and college education should emphasize the importance of students learning by thinking rather than by rote. But the Rev. Fr. Donovan held that "no man can be taught to think, he must learn to do so himself." Mr. Hebert, using the statistics of a popular poll which estimated that only 19 per cent of newspaper readers read the editorial pages, pointed out that "apparently this

A resolution to protest the current Jewish persecution in Germany to the German Embassy in Washington, D. C. was passed. The resolution expressed "deepest condemnation and censure of these inhuman atrocities."

It also was resolved to send a letter to the State Department which implored "the government of the United States in conjunction with other democratic governments to accept our responsibility in providing havens of refuge for the oppressed."

## Central Labor Union Protests Nazis' Anti-Semitic Campaign

Opposition to the Nazi government in Germany in its maltreatment of minorities, particularly of Hebrews, was voiced in a resolution adopted unanimously by the Central Labor Union Wednesday night.

The resolution warned against the spread of such intolerance to other countries and commended the stand of President Roosevelt in the matter. The union voted to send a copy of the resolution to the President, the German ambassador to the United States, William Green, president of the A. F. of L. and the Maine Federation of Labor.

The union also resolved to support any individual or organization working toward the rehabilitation of the Port of Portland and to support the Moving Picture Operators local in its current dispute.

The Portland Building Trades Council affiliated with the union. Elected delegates to the union from the Council were John A. Archambeau, Philip Libby and Fred Hodgkins.

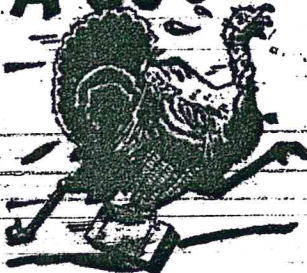
